Workshop Purpose:

STAT-MD Training teaches enhanced diagnostic consultation and screening procedures to pediatric medical providers serving young children. This two day virtual workshop provides training in conducting autism-focused assessments with children, ages 18 to 36 months. Emphasis is on incorporating time-sensitive consultation models into community practice. Training components include:

- Performing interactive screening with the Screening Tool for Autism in Toddlers and Young Children (STAT)
- Conducting developmentally sensitive caregiver interviews
- Formulating diagnostic impressions and communicating them to caregivers
- Identifying appropriate billing and coding procedures
