The Museum staff person will ask my group some questions and take my temperature. They will hold a thermometer near my forehead. It will make a beeping sound when it is done.



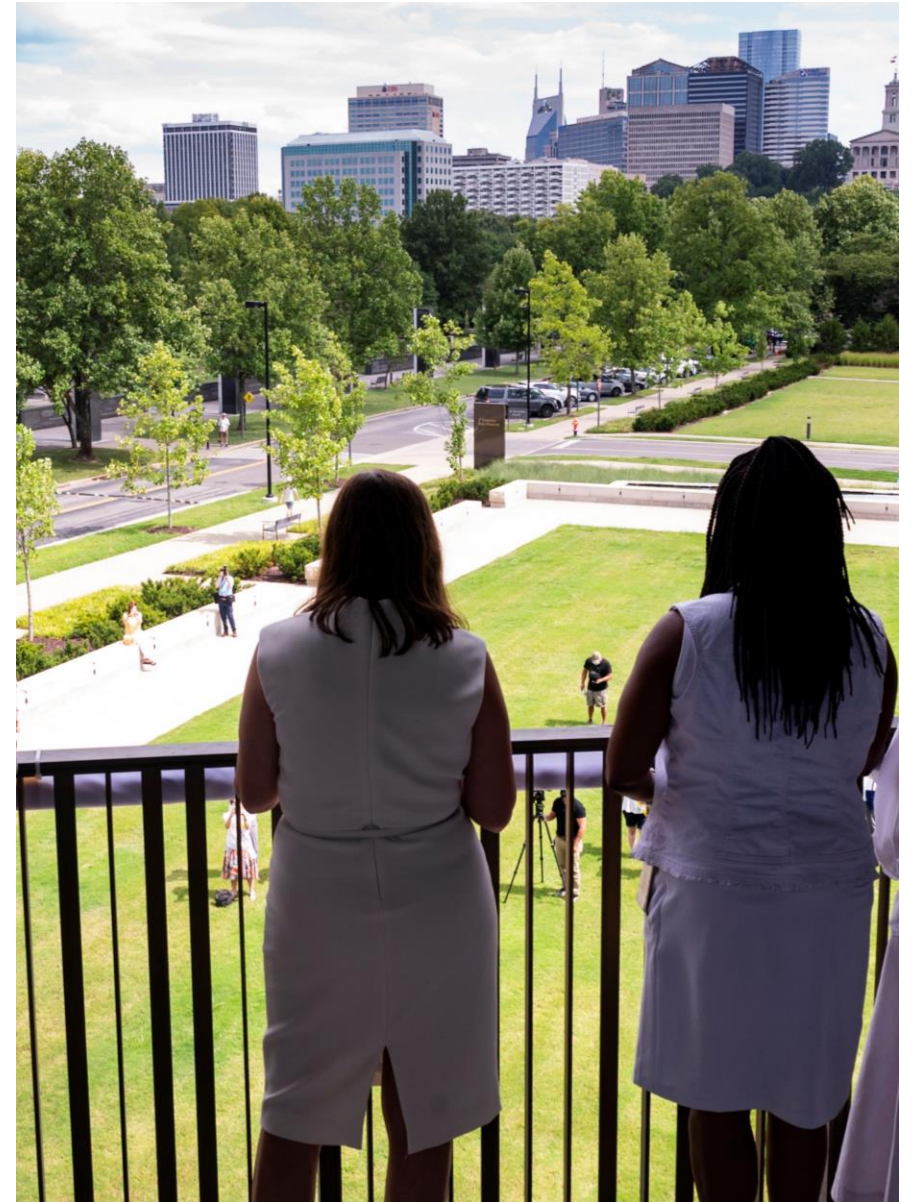
While we are at the Museum, I need to stay with my group. There are signs on the floor to remind us to spread out from other visitors.
