EarlyWorks Children's Museum

A General Visit to the Museum

I will try to always stay with my grown up while we tour the museum. There may be other people exploring in the exhibits and it is okay. If an exhibit is too loud, I can cover my ears with my hands or ask my grown up to go to a quieter space. I will do my best to be respectful by sharing, waiting my turn, having a quiet voice, and walking. Some exhibits will have signs that tell me how many people are allowed inside at a time. I may have to be patient and wait my turn.

There may be some exhibits that are only at the museum for a short time. I can ask someone wearing a blue apron what the exhibits are and what I can do at each one.

During my visit to EarlyWorks, I may need to visit the restroom. I can ask my grown up to take me when I need to go.

When our day is over, I will see a gift shop. The gift shop has things I can buy and take home. I might be able to go inside and look around.

When it is time to go, we will leave through the EXIT door. If I follow the rules in the museum, my family will be so proud of me! I may have fun at the EarlyWorks Children's Museum!
