## Manifestation Determination Review (MDR)

An MDR is an evaluation of a student's misconduct to determine whether the misconduct is caused by or substantially related to the student's disability. An MDR must be performed when a local education agency proposes disciplinary measures that will result in a change of placement for a student with a disability.

This document is intended to be used with the MDR File Review and Interview Form to support school staff and educators in preparing for MDR meetings.

Who should attend an MDR?	<ul> <li>Parent</li> <li>A representative of the LEA</li> <li>Relevant members of the student's IEP team as determined by the parent and LEA (e.g., general or special education teachers, school psychologist, related service providers, etc.)</li> </ul>
Factors to Consider During MDR	<ul> <li>What is the behavior that prompted the suspension/explusion?</li> <li>» Describe the behavior that occurred.</li> <li>» Include reports and statements from individuals or witnesses involved.</li> <li>» Was the behavior premeditated or impulsive?</li> <li>What is the student's disability?</li> <li>» Does the student have the ability to understand impact and consequences?</li> <li>» Has the student been given information regarding school rules?</li> <li>» Identify the characteristics of the student's disability(ies), and/or the characteristics that have been exhibited by the student in the past.</li> <li>What does the educational programming for the student include?</li> <li>» Identify current service levels.</li> <li>» Identify how academic and/or behavioral goals are being implemented.</li> <li>» Is there a goal regarding behavior of concern?</li> </ul>
Special considerations if the determined behavior <u>IS</u> a manifestation of the student's disability	<ul> <li>What additional support is needed for this student?</li> <li>» Is there a need to increase supports?</li> <li>» Should goals be modified or added?</li> <li>Does the IEP need to be modified?</li> <li>» Are there goals addressing the behavior(s) of concern?</li> <li>» If reoccurring, is the behavior of concern reflected in the present levels of the IEP?</li> <li>A Functional Behavior Assessment (FBA) must be completed.</li> </ul>



Unidentified Students	<ul> <li>LEAs must conduct MDRs for unidentified students if:         <ul> <li>the student's parents identified concerns in writing to the school team or the student's teacher identified concerns for additional testing.</li> <li>the student's parent had requested an evaluation.</li> <li>the student's teacher or other school personnel expressed specific concerns about a pattern of behavior.</li> </ul> </li> <li>LEAs are not required to conduct MDRs for unidentified students if:         <ul> <li>the student was referred for an initial evaluation, but the student's parent did not provide consent to conduct an initial evaluation.</li> </ul> </li> <li>the student was determined eligible, but the student's parent did not provide consent for the initial provision of services.</li> <li>the school team evaluated the student and determined the student was ineligible for special education and related services.</li> </ul>
Helpful Reminders	<ul> <li>Parents must be provided at least 24 hours notice prior to holding the MDR.</li> <li>The MDR must be conducted within 10 school days of the incident.</li> <li>Prior written notice should discuss the outcomes of the MDR, specially detailing how the team reached the conclusion.</li> <li>Prior written notice should discuss if additional supports, testing, or services were considered and the outcome.</li> </ul>
